a) Dwindling membership interest 46 b) Poor election participation 47 c) NAPE Focal Points 48 9 **President's Report** 49 60 The President in his report thank members for their continued support through a very challenging year marked by socio-economic downturn as a result of the removal of fuel subsidy and the floating of the 51 Naira. While acknowledging that this situation has led members to adjust their lifestyles, he assured 52 members that the Executive Committee members continued to seek avenues to join policy discussions 53 on ways to improve the current situation. 54 55 The President briefly highlighted some of NAPE activities including the ongoing search for a new 56 secretariat location. Financial management measures, sponsorship outreach, and investment 57 opportunities. He further highlighted the sale of Sangotedo property and ongoing litigation concerning 58 the Ogombo property. 59 60 Continuing education initiatives highlighted include the virtual Summer School and collaborations with 61 organizations like NMGS. The NAPE Foundation's issues with its Naira account suspension were also 62 reported to be resolved. Collaboration efforts with various organizations and participation in 63 international events were highlighted with attendance to the Sub-Saharan Africa International 64 Petroleum Exhibition & Conference (SAIPEC), the Nigerian International Energy Summit (NIES) the 65 Nigerian Oil & Gas (NOG) Conference and the SEG/AAPG IMAGE Conference which either had speaking 66 slots or created sidebars for collaboration. 67 68 The President also reported the Young Professionals' change in leadership and their initiatives with a 69 good geographic spread from Lagos to Warri and Kano. The President also gave an overview of the 70 election process for the offices of the President Elect, Vice-President and UAP Chair while noting the 71 decline in interest in candidate participation. The importance of sustaining the association's value 72 proposition and encouraging member involvement in leadership roles was emphasized. 73 74 75 The President also presented the following to the assembly as recipients of the 2023 NAPE awards: **NAPE Fellowship Award:** 76 1. Ifeanyi Ikwueze 87 88 The President also highlighted a proposal for a new North American Chapter, subject to AGM approval. 89 Lastly, the President closed by expressing gratitude to various stakeholders, acknowledging their 90 contributions to the successful year, and thanking attendees for their time, inviting them to enjoy the 91 rest of the conference. 92

Comments & Remarks from AGM on the President's Report 94 95 1. Dr. Mayowa Afe thanked the President and Exco for the good outing for NAPE during the year. He mentioned that there is a proposal for the creation of a NAPE North America Chapter and 96 asked that the AGM considers and supports the creation of the new chapter. 97 98 2. Dr. Mayowa Afe further stated that he noticed that the Aret Adams award wasn't contained in 99 the list of awards mentioned by the President and wondered why. The Vice President stated 100 that there was no nomination or application for the Aret Adam's Award category which is why 101 no one was listed for the award. 102 103 3. Dr. Mayowa Afe further stated that he noticed that NAPE is a bit distant to the government and 104 mentioned that there is a need for NAPE to get close to the government, especially the National 105 Assembly where policies which affect the industry are being formulated daily. 106 10 **Board of Trustee (BOT) Annual Report** 107 108 The report was presented by Chief Chamberlain Oyibo, FNAPE, who stated that the 5-man Board of Trustees (BoT) is composed of distinguished members including himself, Dr. Daniel Lambert-109 Aikhionbare, FNAPE, Mr. James Orife, FNAPE, Dr. Olayiwola Fatona, FNAPE, and Dr. Austin Avuru, 110 FNAPE, with Dr. Emmanuel Maduawia serving as the Secretary to the Board. 111 112 In terms of roles and responsibilities, it was reported that according to Section 16 of the 2020 Amended 113 Constitution, the BoT's duties are outlined as follows: 114 1. The Board of Trustees, consisting of five (5) Active or Emeritus members nominated by the 115 Executive Committee and ratified at the Annual General Meeting, shall hold office for five (5) 116 years. 117 118 2. The Trustees are empowered to accept and hold in trust all movable and immovable assets 119 belonging to the Association in their joint names on behalf of the Association. An Asset 120 Management Committee (AMC) is to be established by the Board of Trustees to oversee all 121 assets of the association. 122 123 3. All necessary documents requiring signatures or execution by the Trustees may be signed by 124 the chairman and one (1) other member of the Board of Trustees. 125 126 4. The Board of Trustees is tasked with ensuring the incorporation of the NAPE Foundation (The 127 Foundation) as a non-profit Trust Fund in accordance with the Laws of the Federal Republic of 128 Nigeria, aligning with the vision, mission, and core values of the Association. The Trustees are 129 130 also responsible for overseeing the NAPE Foundation. 131 132 5. The Board of Trustees is required to convene a minimum of three (3) meetings annually. 133 Regarding major highlights of the year, it was reported that the BoT held three (3) virtual meetings 134 throughout the year to support the endeavors of the NAPE Executive Committee and Project 135 Implementation Committee. 136 137 Concerning NAPE Landed Properties, significant updates and resolutions were provided as follows: 138 The BoT concluded the sale of Sangotedo land, ensuring all necessary documentation was in 139 place to progress the sale. 140 141
